	Bing	Mid June Early July	Large, dark red fruit with reddish-purple flesh; firm and meaty.	Well known, popular cherry; susceptible to cracking	Pollinate with any other cherry on this list
	Black Gold	June	Large, moderately firm dark red fruit with dark purple flesh and good flavor	Crack resistant, late bloomer, heavy producer	Self-fertile
	Early Burlat	May/June	Large, sweet, dark red, flavorful. Medium firm fruit	Very productive. Resistant to canker; susceptible to cracking.	Pollinate with any other cherry on this list
	Glacier	Mid June	Large, dark red, very flavorful, sweet.	Crack resistant. Developed at WSU	Self-fertile
	Kristin	Mid July	Large, glossy dark red fruit; firm, meaty and juicy red flesh	Heavy producer, crack resistant	Pollinate with any other cherry on this list
	Lapins	Late July	Large dark red fruit; firm with rich, aromatic, sweet flavor	Heavy producer; crack resistant	Self-fertile. Good pollinator for other cherries
	Montmorency	Late June	Medium sized, bright red fruit with firm yellow flesh. Tart, tangy flavor	The standard for pie cherries; great for freezing and canning	Self-fertile. Good pollinator for other cherries
	Rainier	Late July	Large yellow fruit with red blush; firm, sweet fruit	Productive, vigorous tree; crack resistant	Pollinate with any other cherry on this list
	Stella	June	Large dark red fruit with sweet juicy flesh	Productive. Resists cracking.	Self-fertile
	Vandalay	July	Medium to large wine red fruit.	Spreading habit. Good disease resistance	Self-fertile.
