	Fuyu <small>Jiro Oriental</small>	Medium sized, round, flattened orange-red fruit; light orange flesh is firm, crunchy & sweet. Non-astringent.	Grows about 20-30 feet tall. May not reliably set fruit in PNW, site in sunny warm spot.	Self-fertile
	Prairie Sun <small>American</small>	Orange yellow; sweet & firm seedless fruit	American Persimmon; good for fresh eating or cooking; full sun & good drainage	Self-fertile

	Desert King	Yellowish green fruit with sweet strawberry colored flesh. Early ripening variety suited to cooler PNW summers	Grow about 8 to 10 feet tall and wide. Site in a warm sunny spot for best chance of fruit ripening	Self-fertile
	Lattarula	Greenish yellow fruit with sweet honey colored flesh. Great fresh, canning, drying.	One of the most reliable in the PNW; grows about 8 to 10 feet. Warm and sunny site for fruit ripening	Self-fertile
	Violette de Bordeaux	Small to medium purple black fruit with sweet, rich red flesh	Site in a warm and sunny spot, may not fruit reliably in PNW cool summers. Grows about 8 to 10 feet tall and wide.	Self-fertile
